About our trip to Hampi and Mysore - 22.02.05 - 28.02.05

After endless phone calls and some meetings we finally started the trip, our first day, on 22nd of February 2005 early in the morning flying with Air Sahara to Bangalore. Sheila acted like a mother hen organizing her chicks.

In Bangalore some met friends or did sight seeing. At 10.00 p.m. In the evening we boarded the Hampi Express for Hospet and arrived early next morning, more or less crumpled.

From Hospet to Hampi the "Srt. Sheila Ghatate Group" was brought in four cars to two different hotels. One was a wilderness resort called "Boulders", situated between huge boulders in the middle of nowhere, the other accommodation was KSTDC Hotel in Hampi itself. The "Boulders" experienced adventurous river crossings in a kind over dimensional bread-baskets.

The second day started with an introduction about Hampi, the capital of the vast Hindu kingdom of the Vijayanagar covering almost all of Southern India, given by the director of the museum. He himself was leading the excavation works in the 80's and was an enthusiatic archeologist.

Armed with umbrellas, sunglasses, hats and water bottles we stumbled over ancient walls and steps, melting in the heat of midday, and admired the remains of beautiful stone carving and architecture.

A wonderful recovery we found in an alternative little restaurant under a huge mango tree overlooking the most charming landscape along a riverside.

The Third day we drove a convoy of four Qualis to the beautiful temples of Aihole and Pattadakal, 4th and 5th century and magnificent rock temples of Badami, overlooking the lake of Agastryatirtha in the setting sun.

Before leaving by overnight train back to Bangalore we were shown and explained the ruins of the royal palaces, the queens bath, huge step wells and other remains of the ancient royal city of Hampi on our fourth day.

Bleary-eyed and hungry we started our fifth day, boarding a coach, which brought us to the Southern Star Hotel in Hassan. Part of the group had left in Bangalore for Delhi. After a substantial breakfast, pooja and tank filling, we finally left for the temples of Halebid and Belur of the Hoysala period and could admire the most elaborate stone carvings, The sun stood high and we desperately jumped from one hot stone slab to the other. After another three-hours ride we reached the hotel in Hassan and fell to bed.

On our sixth day we left by coach after breakfast for Mysore. In Mysore itself we first drove on Camundi hill to pay a visit to the Camundeshvari - temple and enjoyed the spectaculous view over Mysore. A short glimpse at a huge Nandi and an extended sightseeing tour through the fairy tale palace of the Maharajas of Mysore, which is enormously decorated from floor to ceiling with paintings, tiles and crystels from all over the world - an Indian "Neuschwanstein" - followed before we returned to the hotel to prepare for our highlight of the tour. Thanks to Gita Devi the Maharaja of Mysore had invited us for a dinner party. At night the castle looked even more like a fairy tale. Millions of bulbs illuminated the outlines of the buildings. Colorful painted elephants, camels, bulls and horses, soldiers with silver lances, music and dancers welcomed us in the courtyard. We felt like being taken back into another century. We enjoyed very much the warm hospitality, the cocktails and a wonderful dinner and last not least flowers and little presents given by His Highness. We kind of floated back to the hotel and into our beds. It was a unique and wonderful experience and evening.

On the seventh and last day, 28th February 2005, the bust brought us back to Bangalore. On the way we visited the summer palace of Tipu Sultan and learnt a lot about worms, coccoons and silk in picturesque villages.

To the airport, into the plane, jumpers on - Delhi had us back.

Thank you very much Mona Aggarwal, Sheila Ghatate, Zakia Zaheer and Yasmita Mehta. You had worked so hard for us. It was a wonderful tour, funny, most interesting, beautiful, sometimes exhausting, hot and wet.
