

Professor Dr. Radha Kumar, an Indian academic and author will be speaking to us about Women's Rights and Feminism. Her main focus is on ethnic conflicts and peace processes from a strongly feminist perspective.

ABOUT THE SPEAKER

Dr. Radha Kumar has a Ph.D from Jawaharlal Nehru University, Delhi and an MA and BA from Cambridge University, UK. She has been a director at the Nelson Mandela Centre for Peace and Conflict Resolution at Jamia Milia Islamia, a reputed educational institution of Delhi. She is currently Director-General of the "Delhi Policy Group", a think-tank, of which she is also a co-founder.

In October 2010, Kumar was appointed by the Government of India as one of the three interlocutors for bringing about lasting peace and normalisation in Jammu and Kashmir.

Her published works include, "Divide and Fall?: Bosnia in the Annals of Partition", "Negotiating Peace in Deeply Divided Societies: A Set of Simulations", "Making Peace with Partition", "A History of Doing: Movements for Women's Rights and Feminism in India, 1900-1990", "Bosnia-Herzegovina: Between War and Peace" (Co-editor). Her articles have been published in reviews such as Foreign Affairs, the Centre for European Policy Studies, the World Policy Journal, and the Brown Journal of World Affairs. She is a frequent Op Ed contributor to The Indian Express, DNA, and other Indian newspapers.

We are familiar with the iconography of the Dancing Lord Shiva, Nataraj, surrounded in an aureole of flames with his flowing locks, with coiled snakes as his ornaments, his left foot elegantly raised as his right foot rests on a prostrate figure! However, how many years did it take for this iconography to emerge and was he always known as Nataraj? These and several associated issues will be touched upon while understanding the philosophy of the iconography of Nataraj, the Cosmic dancer!

About Shovana Narayan

Charting new paths, Padmashri Shovana Narayan, is perhaps the only example of a person who has relentlessly pursued two parallel exacting professional careers, achieving distinction and great heights in both. Not only is she India's most the eminent and venerated Kathak Guruperformer-choreographer but has also served in the civil services, Indian Audit and Accounts (1976 batch) until her retirement. Since 1970, her performances have earned her the reputation of being a silent social activist and crusader, a path breaker and a role model. She is multi-hued with soliloquies, operas, films, author, researcher, and with several international collaborative and philosophical works. For her outstanding achievements and contribution in the field of dance, she has received over 28 awards including the President of India's awards of Padmashri in 1992 and the Sangeet Natak Akademi award for 1999-2000 in 2001, besides the Delhi Govt's Parishad Samman, and Japan's OISCA award. She has been conferred D.Litt (HC) besides holding 2 (two) MPhil degrees (Defence & Strategic Studies and in Social Sciences), and a Master's degree in Physics, 1972. She was also shortlisted for the Distinguished Alumni Award, University of Delhi, 1997. She is married to Dr. Herbert Traxl, an Austrian diplomat who had served as his country's ambassador in several countries including India. The two have a son.

In Conversation with Saad Bin Jung

Saad Bin Jung on his book Matabele Dawn.

"After thirty years in the field, I have come to define conservation as humanity's ceaseless ethical pursuit of allowing things to just be in nature, allowing nature to find its own balance without interference from any side."

Saad Bin Jung is a former Indian cricketer who played first-class cricket from 1978 to 1984. He is now a conservationist and author. A member of the Pataudi royal family whose grandfather captained the Indian Test team, Saad Jung grew up in Hyderabad and attended Hyderabad Public School and Nizam College in Hyderabad.

Saad and his wife Sangeeta now run eco-resorts on the Kabini River in Karnataka, and on the Cauvery River and at Bandipur National Park in Kerala. They aim to reconcile the needs of the local people with the needs of conservation. They have also been taking safari tours to Africa since 1995.

He has written three books: Wild Tales from the Wild, about the people and wildlife of the Mangala valley in Karnataka; Subhan and I, My Adventure with the Angling Legend of India, about angling for mahseer in the Cauvery River; and a novel, Matabele Dawn, a thriller set in Africa and India.

ARTS AND MUSEUMS

Talk By Mr. Manav Gupta

Eminent artist, Manav Gupta, is known for his mastery over light and colour. He has been acknowledged as one of India's most erudite and versatile contemporary artists and a "maverick genius" by art writers and critics.

With works sold by Christies, Bonham's, Philip de Pury and in several private, corporate and public collections, he is listed by The Financial Times as one of the ten contemporary artists from India whose works are well received and sought after.

Manav has executed, perhaps, the two biggest solo commissioned artworks in recent years; the five floor 10,000 sq. ft. Mega Mural at Airtel Centre (world record) and the Indo Bhutan Friendship Mural in Bhutan. He is the only artist especially invited by the Ministry of Environment, Govt. of India, to create one-minute films on Climate Change as Public Service Messages.

Manav was invited to stay by the former President of India, Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam, at the Family Wing of the Rashtrapati Bhavan as the first artist in residence ever. He exhibited his paintings there at the request of the President.

The artist's concern for the environment has been evident in his works right from the very beginning of his art journey. Currently on display at the Plaza Steps, India Habitat Centre, is his Public Art Installation, "Rain, the Ganga Waterfront along Time Machine" (shown below), a suite of Environmental Art Installations on the Ganga as the river flows along the passage of time.

Manav will talk about this installation and also show us, and talk about, some of his other works. We look forward to an interesting morning with him. As they say, "Art washes away from the soul the dust of everyday life"......

APRIL FESTIVALS

Good Friday to Easter Monday, April 3-6. Easter is a festival and holiday celebrating the Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. Good Friday commemorates the crucifixion and death of Jesus by the Romans at Cavalry. Easter Sunday is the oldest Christian holiday and the most important day of the church year because of the significance of the crucifiction and resurrection of Jesus Christ, the events upon which Christianity is based. Easter is preceded by Lent, a 40 day period of fasting, prayer, and penance. Easter Monday is the day after Easter Sunday and is celebrated as a holiday in largely Christian cultures.

Hanuman Jayanti, April 4th. Celebrated to commemorate the birth of Hanuman, the Vanara god, it is widely venerated throughout India. Hanuman, an ardent devotee of Lord Rama, is worshipped for his unflinching devotion to the god. An important festival of Hindus, Hanuman is the symbol of strength and energy. He is said to be able to assume any form at will, wield rocks, move mountains, dart through the air, seize the clouds and rival Garuda in swiftness of flight. He is worshipped in folk tradition as a deity with magical powers and the ability to conquer evil spirits

Baisakhi, April 14th. A festival celebrated in the Punjab region. It coincides with other festivals celebrated on the first day of Baisakh, in some regions of India.

Baisakhi is especially important for the Sikh community as it marks the establishment of the Khalsa. More recently, this festival is also celebrated around the world by the Sikh diaspora. It is also celebrated by Hindus and Buddhists for different reasons including the start of a new year. People in the Punjab Region regard Baisakhi as a harvest festival and the Punjabi New Year.


