Gardening Notes for February

Flowers: Amaranthus, narcissus and lily bulbs, may be sown. Chrysanthemum suckers may be divided and should be transplanted into 6" earthen pots.

Roses: There may be severe attack of powdery mildew. The leaves, young shoots and buds may be coated with a white powdery film. The rose bushes should be sprayed in the first and third week with an insecticide and fungicide. This should be done early in the morning. Foliage feeding can be combined with the spraying of insecticide. Aldrin should be added to the water to guard against termites. Watering should be done once a week in the rose beds and daily in the pots. Hoeing to be done twice a month and suckers and dead blooms to be removed regularly. Well-rotted cow dung manure should be given in the last week. Grafting may be done on rose plants this month.

<u>Vegetables:</u> Summer vegetable seedlings may be transplanted from the polythene bags or earthen pots to the ground. Onions, tomatoes, bringals, and chilies may be transplanted. Cucumbers, spinach, ladies' fingers and french beans may be sown. Vegetables already planted should be given proper attention regarding irrigation.

<u>Lawns:</u> Give sterameal and ammonium sulphate this month. Water immediately. <u>General:</u> Bougainvillea and other hedge plants may be planted this month. For the foliage plants watering should be done once every week. (Excess watering should be avoided.) Crotons, money plants, philodendrons should be protected from frost and cold winds. Ferns should be repotted this month.

Other points suggested by participants:

- 1. The Executive Committee should have experienced members. Some officers should carry on the next year for continuity.
- Members continuously writing letters of excuse for absences from Gen Mtgs should be asked to resign.
- 3. Enforce the rule permitting the same guest to attend only 2 Gen Mtgs in a club year.
- 4 '/ideos need not be taken of club events.
- 5. Keep major club events separate (Gala Night, Diwali, Gen Mtgs to be separate)
- 6. Note of local holidays/festivals to be made when making club's monthly calendar.
- 7. Exec Comm should give warning notices in February and allow time for explanations in March. If no explanation is given or if it is unacceptable, membership should be terminated in April. The Exec Comm should keep a cumulative record of terminations.
- 8. Small group discussions more satisfying for getting to know others. Tours are good for this purpose. Indian and Intern'l members should make more effort to interact.
