Dear Members,

Some of us have just returned from the WIC Trip to Pakistan, our neighbouring country where, sadly, peace is in short supply. We return as ambassadors, in our very small and individual capacities because we witnessed this country's ethos at close quarters. All this thanks to the superb organizational skills of Gugu Anup Singh and Parbeen Kaur – our Trip Leaders. To them, our heartfelt thanks!!

Both are efficient and meticulous in their planning. But, what was unique to this Trip (and I have, over the years, been on many) was another intangible and value-added dimension they added to it. This was the deep generosity, great help and superb hospitality of their numerous friends. They whole-heartedly shared their old friendships to benefit the rest of us. Our thanks again!

Actually, this unique 'Trip to Pakistan' will be indelibly memorable because it worked at three distinct levels of consciousness and included three distinct circuits – the cultural, the pilgrim's route and the nostalgic and emotive re-visiting of past homes.

The cultural included looking at two thousand year old archaeological sites at Taxila, and the more recent Mughul glories of the Lahore Fort and the Badshahi Mosque – all World Heritage Sites. Also, visiting the ancient but still active Salt Mines at Khewra. Wondrous! Cultural was also listening to a specially arranged talk by the gifted writer Daniyal Moeenuddin, and attending a baithak for us of the mystic Sufi poetry of Bulle Shah, sung by the full-throated Sufi singer, Sanam Mawri, in the atmospheric old Haveli Barudkhana, belonging to another old friend! These easy connections are a peculiar and shared sub-continental trait, although the Pakistanis have the added advantage of a beautiful sweetness of speech. Their Punjabi is sophisticated, urbane and evocative and has Urdu and Persian as its bedrock. It is a Punjabi unique to Lahore and is, unfortunately, not heard in Delhi. Their mellifluous speech will resound in our ears for a long time!

The Pilgrims Route took us to Nankana Sahib, Panja Sahib, Dera Sahib and ended with a visit to Harminder Sahib in Amritsar. This had not so much to do with piety as with a deep sense of gratitude that we, in India, are so fortunate to belong to our great secular traditions and are respectful of our composite culture. Mostly! May this continuum be timeless!

There are trips and there are trips – but this 'Trip to Pakistan' was a unique WIC Trip. And I say this as one who has visited Lahore several times in the past few years. Thank you again Gugu and Parbeen. I am so glad I could "arm-twist" you, as you call it, into being Trip Leaders for this Club Year! The privilege of friendship, across four generations. Three of the four generations were on this Trip – my mother and our grand-daughter. These will be our shared memories, as we went down memory lane with my mother.

'THE SILK ROAD'

This illustrated lecture on the Silk Road will tell the story of the thriving trade that linked the Eastern world with the Western world - beginning with the ancient Silk Road. It will also briefly examine the role of explorers - such as Vasco da Gama, Ferdinand Magellan and Sir Francis Drake - as they overcame enormous difficulties to discover new lands and routes to the East. The lectures will examine the Art, Culture, Cuisine, and Inter-influences that this trade made on the lands through which this route passed, as also the struggles that indigenous peoples underwent to retain their autonomy in the face of European trade, missionary activity and influences.

The Silk Road will be introduced by HE, The Ambassador of Turkey. The Principal Speaker will be Dr. Pushpesh Pant, an authority on the Silk Road and the author of the amazing 'INDIA COOKBOOK', with its 1000 recipes, published by PHAIDON.

Giles Tillotson on Nagaur

Giles Tillotson speaks on the historical attractions of Nagaur. Nagaur lies midway between Bikaner and Jodhpur. It is an ancient city with a fort of immense historical and archeological significance.

Giles Tillotson is a writer and lecturer on Indian architecture, art and history. A prolific author, he also works in museum and academic management, in higher education and research, in publishing and in travel. With family roots in Dorset in the UK, he was educated at Trinity College Cambridge, where he read Philosophy, History of Art and Oriental Studies. On completing his PhD, he was elected a Research Fellow at Peterhouse, Cambridge (1986-90). He then taught for fourteen years at the School of Oriental and African Studies, University of London, where he became Reader in History of Art, and Chair of Art & Archaeology. He is also a Fellow (and former Director) of the Royal Asiatic Society, London. His areas of special expertise include: the history and architecture of the Rajput courts of Rajasthan, and of the Mughal cities of Delhi and Agra; Indian architecture in the period of British rule and after Independence; and landscape painting in India. He first visited India in 1979 and returned frequently before settling in the country in 2004.

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FESTIVALS

CHRISTMAS - Dec. 25

From the root word "Christ", Christmas is the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ for Christians all over the world. Folk tradition based on the accounts in the Gospel of Luke as well as the Gospel of Matthew in the Bible recounts the tale of the Messiah being born in a stable, "wrapped in swaddling clothes". It is believed that on that night angels sang in the heavens and the humble shepherds were among the first to visit the Christ child. This is depicted all over the world in the Nativity scenes and creches that are found in homes and churches alike.

The inclusion of the Christmas tree is considered by many as one of the many pagan festival connected to the winter solstice, its origins ascribed to Germany. All the candles and lights during Christmas are in celebration of Lux in Domino: Christ as the light of the world. From Germany, the celebration of Christmas moved to England, and was then spread by King Albert during the reign of Queen Victoria.

HANUKKAH - Dec. 8 - 16, 2012

The Jewish festival of lights is an eight-day celebration that dates back to the 2nd century. It is traditionally celebrated with a nine-branched candelabra known as the Menorah, commemorating the miracle that took place at the temple in Jerusalem during Maccabean Revolt. One day's supply of oil for the temple lights lasted eight days, giving the faithful a lasting symbol of hope.

LOHRI - Jan 13, 2013

A Punjabi cultural festival celebrated on the eve of the winter solstice, Lohri is traditionally linked to the harvest of the rabi crops. Punjabi farmers consider the day after Lohri as the start of the new financial year. Children sing folk songs in praise of Dulla Bhatti and it is considered auspicious to reward them with sweets and savouries. Bonfires are lit in the evenings and an offering is made.

Article III

A Political Scientist by training, Theresa is also an avid collector of frogs, a symbol that carries over to many aspects of her life as she explores nooks and crannies everywhere she goes.

SUNITA KOHLI is a **research-based interior designer, a leader in historical interior architectural restoration and a manufacturer of fine contemporary and classical furniture.** She has worked in several countries, notably **Egypt.** She specializes in the design of public buildings (such as the British Council Building in New Delhi and the Parliament Building in Bhutan), **hotels and resorts, luxury hotel boats, forts, palaces, heritage properties, aircrafts, corporate offices and private residences.** In New Delhi, Sunita Kohli has restored and decorated many **British period buildings** – designed by Sir Edwin Lutyens, Sir Herbert Baker and Sir Robert Tor Russell – notably **Rashtrapati Bhawan, the Prime Minister's Office and Secretariat and Hyderabad House.** She has also restored the **Official Residence of the Prime Minister,** among other official bungalows. In **2005,** Sunita Kohli founded the **'Museum of Women in the Arts, India' (MOWA, India)** "to honour women artists of the past, promote the accomplishments of women artists of the present and assure the place of women artists in the future".

Sunita Kohli has lectured on **'Lutyens and New Delhi'** at principally **Harvard and Emory Universities, at the National Building Museum in Washington DC and in the UK.** Her books under publication are: **'Tanjore Paintings - Golden Icons of South India'; 'Awadhi Cuisine',** co-authored with Jamal Rasool Khan of Jehangirabad. She is also working on a **Children's Series on Indian Culture.** For **'The Millennium Book on New Delhi',** published by Oxford University Press, Sunita Kohli wrote the chapter on Lutyens and New Delhi, titled **'The Creation of a Planned City'.** Sunita is deeply involved with two NGOs – **Satyagyan, an affiliate of 'World Literacy of Canada',** an organization that works with women and children in 400 slum communities in Varanasi and its environs; and is the Chairperson of the Board of Governors of **'Save-a-Mother',** an NGO which is dedicated to decreasing maternal and infant mortality rates in **1200 districts in India.** In **1992,** Sunita Kohli was conferred the **PadmaShri,** by the President of India, "for contribution to national life by excellence in the field of Interior Design and Architectural Restoration".
