Adham Khan's Tomb was built in the 16th century and in popularly known as Bhulbhulaiyan (labyrinth), for a visitor often loses his way in the several passages.

The two baolis (stepped wells) are form the Sultanate period and are worth a visit.



Professor Lokesh Chandra is a well-known scholar of Tibetan, Mongolian, Chinese and Japanese Buddhism. He has written many books and has served in the Indian Parliament. Currently, he is the Director of the International Academy of Indian Culture. Attendance is limited to 35.

Professor Chandra will speak on "The Wisdom and Compassion in Tibetan Art" and show some original scrolls. He will present the sensitivity of the aesthetics of Tibetan painted scrolls, known as thangkas, which symbolize a pictorial awareness of inner experiences. As a Tibetan master has put it:

Who speaks the sound of an echo? Who paints the image in a mirror? Where are the spectacles in a dream? Nowhere at all -That is the nature of the mind

Tibetan thangkas are the meditative universe to transform the environment into intrinsic purity and sublime spontaneity.


