



Uma Vasudev will be talking to us about the books she has written. She is the biographer of Indira Gandhi. "Indira Gandhi; Revolution in Restraint" and "Two Faces of Indira Gandhi" cover the tumultuous years of Indira's rise to power, and the later controversial period of the 1970's and the emergency. Her third book, "Indira Gandhi Courage under Fire" covers her life till her assassination in 1984. Her First novel "Song of Anasuya" came out in 1978, an analytical portrayal of Delhi's high society. Her second novel "Shreya of Sonagarh" ranges over the nuances of a crumbling feudal order.

Her particular interest has been Indian classical music in which she herself took vocal training at Delhi's Gandharva Mahavidyalaya. She has co-ordinated a series on Indian classical musicians for BBC entitled "Eastern Sounds". Her most recent biography is about "Hari Prasad Chaurasia; romance of the Bamboo Reed".

Gurudwara Damadama Sahib

On Wednesday, January 31st the Excursions and Tours group organized a trip to the Gurudwara behind Humayuns Tomb. It was a lovely quiet spot, tucked back in the woods. Anup Singh gave a talk and then a "tour" of the Gurudwara and joined us for tea on the lawn afterwards. For those of us who did not know a lot about Sikkism it was very enlightening. His talk centered on the following ideas:

- The Sikh "religon" is a discipline of discipleship, the fusion of good living, a way of life. There is a primal entity, no deity, one truth, a divine will who is the doer and is with you. If you have no ego and learn you can have communion with the divine will. Universal brotherhood, acceptance of all people, equality are the foundation.

- History starts in 1469 in the Punjab near Lahore where Guru Nanak was born. He was a inquisitive person from the start. In 1499 went for a walk and disappeared. Came back a new person. He then travelled for 12 years, showed God was everywhere. Anup talked of the history of the Sikhs and the Mughal emperors. The 5th and 9th were killed by them. Afterwards, the Sikhs trained to defend their faith. Then Gobind Singh tried to work to have peace. He was the last Guru.
