The Chairman of the Nominating Committee this year, Bapsi Nariman, has made the following suggestions for next year:

Gardening Notes for May

Flowers: Cannas can be planted in new beds. Seeds of the rainy season flowers should be sown in seed beds. Bulbs of tube roses should also be

planted.

Roses: Same as done in April. Start preparing new rose beds in May for planting of rose plants in July. The ground intended for roses must be dug preferably to a depth of two to three feet and good drainage ensured so that there is no water-logging. Fill the beds up about a week before the onset of the monsoon.

<u>Vegetables:</u> Seeds of bringal, cauliflower and chilies may be sown.

Lawns: In May dig up the lawn to a depth of a foot. Turn the earth inside out. Do this twice or thrice so that the roots of the weeds and ant holes are exposed to the hot sun and destroyed by the heat. Keep the earth exposed for about 2-3 weeks. Then sprinkle some sand and slaked lime on the top soil and flood it with water at once. (A handful of slaked lime for every two square feet.) Water is necessary for taking heat out of the lime. Let the earth dry out and then level the ground for the planting of grass.

Before planting new grass, remove any weeds that may be present. After planting, water generously. Within ten days new blades of grass will emerge. Sprinkle water over the grass but do not flood. Keep a sharp eye for any stray weeds and remove them. Throughout the summer every third day

leave the hosepipe on all night and sprinkle water every morning.

In the second year shave the grass to ground level, leaving the roots untouched. Use a rake to let air circulate among the roots. Sprinkle ammonium sulfate on the grass once a month and water immediately. For a good lawn, new grass should be planted after three years.
