We did not lose sight of topics that trouble either: global warming, environmental pollution, endangered species, the sad reality of street children, child labour and the importance of Human Rights.


We planned our Gala to be the climax of our 28th Year, and it really was delightful to find many of you enjoying that special evening with us.




