Fabric painting has been a medium of putting ideas and patterns down on garments. Everyone like to create hand painted garments but not all are able to do so. However, with our paints and technique, artist or non-artist, one can be a genius at painting by making unbelievingly exclusive paintings on your T-shirts, dresses, tablecovers, bedlinen etc. on just about any fabric.

Stained Glass Art

The art of staining glass, by infusing pigment onto its surface, has come down to us from bygone ages. Mediaeval churches and manorial homes used stained glass extensively, to implant religious scenes onto the minds of the worshippers.

The age old method of staining glass was lengthy, tedious and hazardous, but modern methods, while taking out the risk and drudgery have managed to retain all the charm and fascination.

The technique is easily mastered, even by non-craftsmen, and can be done on glass table tops, windows, panels, tiffany lamps and almost anywhere where glass is used.
