


General Meeting Wednesday November 20th, 2002

In early 1970, a group of enthusiastic women from around the world, representing a variety of culture and residing in New Delhi, felt that if they come together they can enrich each other's experiences, expertise & skills. And thus promote understanding and goodwill. The desire for understanding of other points of view, making friends and enjoying cultural activities together was the motivation to go about starting this club.

The inaugural meeting was held November 11th, 1970 and was addressed by Mrs Vijayalakshi Pandit, who was the President of the United Nations General Assembly. The name of the club then was the Delhi Internationsal Women's Club. In order to bring it in line with other Womens International Clubs, the DWIC became the WICD in 1975.

The Club now enters its 33rd year. In the old days a postcard, which had notices of the monthly general meetings to members was sent out by the 'Corresponding Secretary'. The circle activities were duly announced at previous meetings and the absent members were informed. The colourful and attractive Newsletter has now replaced the simple postcard and is brought out by the 'Newsletter Editor'. The 'Recording Secretary's post has been redefined and renamed as 'Secretary'.

Over these many years, we have had enjoyable times together. We have travelled together to fascinating and exotic destinations, discussed books, cooked together and have listened to many a musical notes and beats and held innumerable discussions on a wide range of topics. In the process, we have learned to look at issues from a totally different point of view. The club occupies a very special place in our lives.

These days, as always, the Executive Committee puts in hours of thought and hard work to make these events possible. We have now reply cards for acceptances to meetings to be able to make it convenient for the hostesses to know how many members are expected. Sometimes, due to space constraints, we have to disappoint some who are keen on attending. We shall try to give a chance to all the members to participate. We are sorry that our Hospitality chairperson, Kusuma Rao decided to resign due to her mothers illness. She had been finding it increasingly difficult to spare the time. We welcome Kiran Anand who has agreed to step in to her place. So let's get on with it - join in and have fun in November!

Our Ancestors - how we remember them in different cultures


Presented by members of our club Priya Khanna, Hanan Fattah, Wera Hildebrand, Alexandra Faesler, Mi-Ran Lee

There have been problems with the old reply card system that make the Hospitality Chairperson's job, and planning for events very difficult.

These problems are sometimes caused by members who fill in ticks for every event and then at the last minute ring to cancel. This makes it impossible for people who truly want to attend to fit on the list.

So in order to accomodate everyone, both the Hostesses and club members alike, the Committee has decided to make the Hospitality Chairperson's job a little easier by introducing a new reply card system.

The new system requires members to place a number in the order of preference in the boxes for Circles that they wish to attend - as seen in the example above. Please do not use ticks any more! The preference system will operate in the same way as do preferencial voting systems used in the elections of many countries.

We ask that you co-operate most carefully with the new system - should you inadvertantly fill in your boxes with ticks your name will not be able to be placed before others who have given that particular Circle their high preference numbers. The names of people who have sent ticked cards will be fitted in to Circles that have not already been filled by preferences.
