September 21st, 2-5 pm


Venue: Indian international centre (IIC) Hall Two

Textiles Circle: Royal Fables

It was in 1947 that India became a Democracy and an elected Indian Government replaced the local rulers namely the Princes, Rajas, and Maharajas who were the custodians of crafts, textiles and culture of the region they ruled over. This was reflected in their day-to-day costumes worn in the royal courts and on ceremonial occasions and that of their royal courtiers as well.

Anshu Khanna - Founder at Royal Fables Private Limited. Her biggest contribution to Indian heritage is that she founded an authentic platform that showcases our regal history called Royal Fables. Under this umbrella she has single-handedly helped bring alive the Palace Karkhana culture wherein royal scions work with local master weavers, artists, and craftsmen.

Anshu Khanna is a well-known writer, columnist and Editor who has written extensively on wide-ranging subjects including leadership profiles, retail, art, culture, design and education. She is a visiting professor at NIFT and teaches creative writing and PR to undergraduate students of Fashion Communication.

She is the recipient of Nari Shakti Puraskar, 2018, for her revivalist endeavors. It is the highest civilian honour accorded to women in India by the honourable President of India. Our speaker will be narrating some interesting anecdotes from Royal India, which led to the discovery of some of India's famous textiles.


Book Circle: 'The Second Wife & Other Stories' by Nandini C. Sen



She spent the summer of 2022 at the University of Oxford, St. Cross College as a Chevening Research, Science, and Innovation Leadership (CRISP) Fellow.





Smita Mankad was featured in the book 'She Is' - a compilation of women advancing the Sustainable Development Goals in India - and was featured for SDG 5 - Gender Equality, SDG 8 - Decent Work and Economic Growth and SDG 17 - Reduced Inequalities.
